This year the ceremony was honored by thoughtful addresses from three of our elected officials. Congressman Jim Gerlack spoke of the dedication of our men and women and the importance of supporting our troops in active service. State Representatives Carole Rubley and Duane Milne followed Jim with equally meaningful remarks.

The audience was fortunate to hear poignant renditions of patriotic songs from Jake Haldeman of Paoli's VFW Post 5203 and from the very talented McCauley sisters, Laura and Courtney.

Committee Secretary, Bill Bellew read the names of our local veterans who lost their lives in the service of our country. Bill then moved the crowd with a beautiful reading of "A Soldier" (see page 4).

The Berwyn Fire Company provided an honor guard and a Fire Truck to block off a lane of traffic on Route 30 during the activities.

TREDYFFRIN & EASTTOWN CITIZEN SOLDIERS

The Berwyn Veterans Memorial Committee is compiling a record of Tredyffrin and Easttown's citizen soldiers - men and women who at some time in their lives resided here and who served in the armed forces. A book, listing our citizen soldiers will become a permanent exhibit in the Tredyffrin local history and education center when construction of the Jones log barn at the Wilson Farm Park is complete. Additional copies will be available in our local libraries, and both township buildings.

Using historical data, we have identified more than 1900 veterans who served at some time from the French and Indian War through the Vietnam War, Bosnia, Iraq and Afghanistan. While our listing is comprehensive through WWI, we know that our records from WWII to the present are incomplete. We need the help of area Veterans and residents to identify all of the veterans who served from WWII to the present and who lived in Tredyffrin or Easttown for any portion of their lives. LYMAN PERRY HONORED

The design of the Berwyn Veterans Memorial was the inspiration of architects Lyman Perry and Mathew Moser who provided the professional services at no cost to the community. This included not only the conceptual design but also the structural design, landscape planning and project management. Lyman together with Nancy Ward were instrumental in raising a significant portion of the funds required for the construction of the Memorial that enabled it to be constructed.

Lyman is the son of a WW I and WW II Naval Officer, A graduate and board member of the US Naval Academy, served aboard submarines and was selected by Admiral Rickover for the Nuclear Power Program. He is a distinguished architect who graduated from the University of Pennsylvania with Honors and a Gold Medal for Design. He also served as a Professor of Design at the school for 15 years. His office (Lyman Perry Architects, Ltd.) is located just one block from the Memorial.

GOLD STAR
TREE
DEDICATED

In an effort to acknowledge the hardship faced by mothers and spouses of fallen veterans, the Veterans Association dedicated an 8ft Norway Spruce to those "Gold Star Mothers and Wives". The tree was planted at the Berwyn Train Station at the site used for the town's Christmas celebration.

Three years ago, the Berwyn Devon Business Association (hosts of the Christmas Celebration) were forced to declare the existing tree unsafe. The Veterans Association then financed the removal of the old tree and planting of the new. The present and past trees were both planted by Doyle and McDonnell Nurseries of Berwyn. The new tree will eventually be decorated for the holidays and each bulb dedicated to a local veteran.

A granite plaque was inscribed: To those Gold Star Mothers and Wives..... The tree was dedicated on November 11 at the Memorial Ceremony.
